The month of November brings with it falling leaves, weather changes, football games and we prepare for the upcoming Holiday Season. Thanksgiving Day in many of our homes is a favorite time when families get together to not only share the American tradition but also to remember why we even celebrate this day.

Dominic Pulero in his book *GREEN,WHITE & RED* tells us that Thanksgiving Day was "another way in which the Italian immigrants and their descendants embraced American culture. By doing so, they signaled their acceptance of an important American holiday and, more broadly, the mores and customs of the United States. The lessons about the Pilgrims in our schools helped the young first- and second-generation Italian Americans to see themselves as part of American culture and mainstream, even as they preserved certain Italian customs and traditions at home."

I too, recall our family Thanksgiving dinner as a child. We were nine at the table and the table setting was "the good stuff" - the special wine glasses were out, even for myself and my three sisters. We started with lasagna, then the turkey was brought out with one part missing. The part that "goes over the fence last" was brought out on a separate plate and served to my uncle. We children each got a short glass of Grandpa Nino's homemade wine diluted with water. I was 12 years old before I actually liked the taste of wine. For dessert we had homemade apple pies and, of course, Italian pastries, followed by nuts and fruit then espresso coffee. Grandpa's small cup always got 6 spoons of sugar - I sat next to him on his left -my father on his right — and I counted each spoonful. It always seemed like the longest meal of the year for us.

In the tradition of the holiday I want to express my thanks to Brother Lou DeCarolis and his helpers who made this year's Columbus Day parade the most organized, successful, and enjoyable one yet. Someday we'll find a way to get a few more observers. And of course, my thanks to Sisters Eunice and Susan (and their helpers) for the very successful and enjoyable Christopher Columbus Dinner Dance as well as the Ad Book. Sister Jen - that centerfold was praised by many! Upcoming we have our wine tour with Sister Linda Agnello and Sister Jen Gugino's Turkey Raffle Dinner. We hope you all are planning to attend.






