Festa della Repubblica 2010 IACC, Rochester Sister Elizabeth Osta shares with us these wise words on the two-year anniversary of her breast cancer diagnosis.

Broken, Open

I comb the beaches of Amelia Island, bare feet dipping in brisk waters, gentle waves lapping at my toes and creeping up my ankles, looking for perfect shells, those that have survived in one piece. Whole. A fragment catches my eye, its color a vibrant fuchsia, its shape unique. I pick it up and rub my thumb and forefinger over its smooth surface, admiring its swirl of unexpected color.

After my visit with it, I bend to the sandy beach to replace this shell piece and continue on my walk, the blue skies and rolling waters calming, the breeze refreshing, the smell reminiscent of other ocean visits. But I hesitate before putting the shell down. I hold it in my palm, turning it over once again, its smooth surface warming to my touch, looking at its beauty, wondering about its journey. Isn't this what we all are ultimately, fragments of color and beauty in the mix of life? Pieces of life, weathered by wind and storms, warmed by a gentle touch, tossed about in the world's waves?

I slip the shell piece into my jacket pocket, continue my walk, pausing here for a part of sand dollar, there for a partial conch, eyes finding shells I might never have noticed, shells full of character and blooming with color and shape. There are many to choose from, many passed over by other shell seekers, those seeking the perfect, the whole.

While I still pick up some unbroken shells, more often, I gravitate to the pieces, their imagined stories irresistible, travels from the ocean floor, tossed about in the waves, adding to their character, their power. I breathe in and feel the tightness in my breast where scars still sensitive to the touch tell the tale of my own brokenness, my recent recovery from breast cancer ebbing and flowing as energy returns. As the wind blows and I continue on my way, a smile splashes my face, and a feeling of oneness fills me. I grasp a silver shard from the water's edge, a bit of oyster, and run my finger over its unexpected ridges, its perfectly formed bumps.
