# ITALIAN EASTER

### La Madonna Che Scappa in Piazza - Abruzzo Region

Sulmona, in the Abruzzo region, celebrates Easter Sunday with La Madonna Che Scappa in Piazza. On Easter Sunday people dress in green and white, colors of peace, hope, and resurrection, and gather in the main piazza. The woman playing the Virgen Mary is dressed in black. As she moves to the fountain, doves are released and the woman is suddenly dressed in green. Music and feasting follow.

### Holy Week on the island of Sardinia

The island of Sardinia is a part of Italy steeped in tradition and a good place to experience festivals and holidays. Because of its long association with Spain, some Easter traditions are strongly linked to the Spanish Semanta Santa.

#### Florence - Scoppio del Carro

In Florence, Easter is celebrated with the *Scoppio del Carro*, explosion of the cart. A huge, decorated wagon is dragged through Florence by white oxen until it reaches *Basilica di Santa Maria del Fiore* in Florence's historic center. Following mass, the Archbishop sends a doveshaped rocket into the cart, igniting the fireworks held in the cart. This spectacular display is followed by a parade in medieval costumes.

# **BUON COMPLEANNO ITALIA**

## CENTOCINQUANTI ANNI 1861 – 2011

A Brief Summary...

Back in 1848 after popular uprisings in Europe due to crop failures and ideas of liberation, two revolutionary exiles named Mazzini from London and Garibaldi from Uruguay, joined together in Italy to participate in the struggle with the idea to form a republic. The two were together at Bergamo under King Charles Albert's control and were defeated. Both retreated to Switzerland. Eventually, Garibaldi was called to Rome by Mazzini to defend Rome against King Ferdinand, the French and the Neapolitans. The French were defeated and then the Neapolitans. A truce was called during which time Garibaldi had red shirts made for all of his legionnaires (the shirts later became the symbol of Italian Unification). As a result of the French interventions, the "Italian" efforts were ultimately met with failure.

In 1856, Count Cammillo di Cavour, prime minister of the Kingdom of Sardinia, convinced Napoleon to take up arms again against the Austrians who had occupied the region of Piedmont. This time the French came to the aid of the Italians and defeated the Austrians and Lombardy was surrendered to Napoleon III.

In 1854 after a time spent in both the United States (Staten Island) and South America, Garibaldi returned to Italy and formed an alliance with Victor Emmanuel II, King of Sardinia and Corsica. In 1859 he led the expedition against the Austrians in the Alps and in 1860 he conquered Sicily and then Naples, which he delivered to Victor Emmanuel. By 1860 only the region around Venice remained Austrian and the French would be asked to protect the Papal States from annexation to Italy by the revolutionaries. By March 17, 1861 a united Italy was established with Victor Emmanuel as its ruler and its capital in Torino. The Papal State of Rome was still not part of Italy, nor was the Austrian-held Venice.

In 1866 after war with Austria, Venice was turned over to Italy and now Rome, standing alone and unprotected, was overtaken by Italian troops. In July 1871 Rome became the capital of a united Italy. Only the Vatican City, residence of the Pope, remained as a separate state until 1929 when "an independent Vatican City was established" with diplomatic relations between Italy and the newly formed Papal State of the Vatican City.

In early 2011, Italy's President Giorgio Napolitano officially opened ceremonies celebrating the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the birth of the Republic of Italy. The year 1861 is recognized as the beginning of an independent and unified Italy. March 17<sup>th</sup> is the date the first Italian Parliament was assembled. Torino, the first capital of the Republic, is the center of the celebrations (Rome did not become capital until 1871). Here in Rochester, the Festa della Republica" will as usual, take place with a ceremony on June 2<sup>nd</sup>.

Much of the information in this brief essay is taken from articles found in two recent newspapers – The Italian Tribune and L'Italo-Americano. I encourage all of my Italian American friends to read more in depth works describing the very interesting process that the people of Italy took to become an independent republic. Of historical interest to our members of the Order Sons of Italy in America, is that when Garibaldi came to the United States he stayed at the Meucci home on Staten Island, which today houses the Sons of Italy's Garibaldi – Meucci Museum.
