Peperonata – sautéed peppers

Sister Rosita shares with us this recipe for the sautéed peppers from the Sicilian Dinner last May.

Peperonata - sautéed peppers

4 tbsp. canola/olive oil blend (75% canola/25% extra virgin olive oil)
3 potatoes* (~1 lb.), peeled & sliced ¼"x2" pieces (optional)
4 tbsp. extra virgin olive oil, divided
1 large onion, thin julienne
1 lb. red bell peppers, in thin julienne
2 c. plum tomatoes, drained & coarsely diced, liquid reserved
Pinch of dried oregano
Salt & pepper to taste

Fry the potatoes: Dry sliced potatoes with paper or clean kitchen towel. Place the oil blend into a large fry pan and heat until shimmery. Add a small batch of potatoes to the oil, making sure that potatoes are not crowed. Fry on both sides until golden. Drain on paper towels and lightly sprinkle with salt while they are still warm. Repeat until all potatoes are golden.

Drain excess oil. Add 1 tbsp. olive oil to the pan and heat until shimmery. Add the onion and cook, stirring once, until slightly golden. Remove to a plate. Add 1 tbsp. olive oil to the pan and repeat with peppers. Remove to a plate.

Add 1 tbsp. of olive oil to the pan and heat. Add a pinch of oregano & cook until fragrant, about 20 seconds. Add the drained tomatoes and cook, stirring once, until liquid has evaporated. Toss the onions, peppers & potatoes with the tomato and add the reserved tomato juice.

Cover and simmer until vegetables are tender, 20-30 minutes. Add the last tbsp. of olive oil and season to taste with salt & pepper. Serve warm or at room temperature.

Names related to the Unification of Italy (based on article in PRIMO Mag 3rd Ed 2011)

1) Brokered agreement with France to help oust Austria from Italy.

2) Conquered Italian peninsula in 1797 and empowered Italians with troops and the desire for unification.

3) Known as "Soul of Italy" –sought class free Italian Republic – a political thinker –elected as triumvir to lead the short lived Republic.

4) Recognized as "Father of the Fatherland", King of Sardinia, and King of all Italy (after the Resorgimento)._____

5) The tricolored Italian flag, mimicking the French tricolored, was inaugurated by the Italians to pay homage to this man's role in the unification of France.

6) Sardinia King who led failed revolt against Austria. Upon his death Piedmont-Sardinia was handed over to his son Victor Emanuel II. _____

7) Organized insurrection in 1830s targeting Genoa. Arrested and exiled to London where he created a school for Italian children. After Resorgimento criticized new government for neglecting the South and poor._____

8) Born in poverty in Nice (at time part of Genoa) – leading icon of defiance- known as "THE General". Went to S. America in 1842 leading Uraguayans in Civil war where he introduced the famous "band of red shirts".

9) Proclaimed King of Italy by grace of God and will of the people.

10) Called Giuseppe Garibaldi for aid in 1848 from S. America but due to his wanting only to expand the Papal rule, Garibaldi sided with Victor Emanuel in the fight for unification. He eventually lost the Papal State and was relegated to the Vatican._____

11) Led 1st revolt in 1848 which failed but in 1860 his fame as a great leader was established winning a series of battles on the Kingdom of the 2 Sicilys and handed the conquered states to Victor Emanuel II.

12) Is to Italy what George Washington is to America. After his death Mussolini hoped to win public sentiment by claiming the Fascist "black shirts" were the legitimate heirs to his "red shirts".
