FESTA ITALIANA at the IACC

This year's Festa Italiana will be July 20th – 22nd on the grounds of the Italian American Community Center. Once again our lodge will have a booth where we will sell Italian-themed novelties as a fundraiser for our lodge. In the past, the money from the festa has been used for scholarships and to offset various costs of running the lodge throughout the year. It is usually one of our biggest fundraisers of the year.

We are again looking for volunteers to help man the booth. Over the past few years we have had so many members volunteer to help out in the booth that at times we've had more help than we needed. If I have to pay the IACC for our volunteers to get in then it ends up coming out of the profits for the lodge and we don't want that either.

We encourage everyone to come out to the festa and hang out with friends and family. The evenings are a lot of fun when the lights come on and the music starts and if you bring your lawn chairs you can sit out in the open around the tent area and enjoy the atmosphere. I've enclosed a work schedule – please call or email me right away to let me know when you're available to help.

OSIA HISTORY

Originally called "Figli d'Italia," the Order Sons of Italy in America® was established in the Little Italy neighborhood of New York City on June 22, 1905, by Vincenzo Sellaro, M.D., and five other Italian immigrants who came to the United States during the great Italian migration (1880-1923). Their aim was to create a support system for all Italian immigrants that would assist them with becoming U.S. citizens, provide health/death benefits and educational opportunities and offer assistance with assimilation in America.

Highlights in OSIA's history:

In its early years, OSIA established free schools to teach immigrants English and centers to help them become U.S. citizens.

The first OSIA lodges established orphanages and homes for the elderly, life insurance and mortuary funds, credit unions, welfare societies and scholarship funds to aid members in need.

During World Wars I and II, OSIA members bought war bonds and war stamps to support the war effort, and lodges competed with each other to contribute the most money to the Red Cross.

In World War II, the OSIA Supreme Council (national officers) issued a resolution urging members to donate one day's salary to the national defense.

To date, OSIA members have given more than \$119 Million to educational programs, disaster relief, cultural advancement and medical research.

NEWS FROM ITALY

(ANSA) - Rome, June 1 - Crisis or not, there is one thing Italians are not willing to give up - ice cream.

Despite the economic downturn, the Italian Institute of Ice Cream (IGI) said on Friday that the total industry turnover for pre-packaged ice cream was up 2.2% in 2011, reaching approximately two billion euros. Not only that, according to IGI gelato is consumed all year long, not just in the hotter months, and more frequently at home with retail sales up 3.9%.

And for families with four-legged friends, an ice cream for man's best friend, IceBau, was released at the gelato festival in Ancona recently, ready to hit the retail market this summer.

ROME -- The strong quake which struck Italy on Tuesday, killing 15 and destroying buildings, has also dealt a blow to Modena's balsamic vinegar industry -- days after a quake in the area hit Parmesan production.

The industry has suffered losses totalling €15 million (\$18 million), according to the head of the traditional balsamic vinegar consortium Enrico Corsini, who said stocks had been "seriously damaged" as tremors hit the area.

The Pontirol company based in San Felice sul Panaro -- one of the worst-hit towns -- lost practically everything after its warehouses were flattened, while smaller warehouses owned by other producers were also badly damaged.

The 5.8 quake which struck Tuesday morning and the series of tremors of other 5.0 magnitude that followed "will bring the regional economy to its knees," Corsini said, adding that 200 businesses in the sector were affected. The north of the Modena region, where the quake was felt particularly strongly, is home to dozens of balsamic vinegar producers. The consortium said some producers claimed to have lost over 100,000 liters of the costly delicacy.

The gourmet vinegar, sprinkled on salads and added to sauces the world over, can cost up to €1,500 a liter. The Emilia Romagna region has some of Italy's richest farmland and is known for many delicacies including balsamic vinegar, Parmesan, Parma ham and Bolognese sauce, which are exported around the world. Culinary production in the area suffered a heavy blow just 10 days before when a 6.0-magnitude quake struck the same region, devastating Parmesan warehouses and costing the industry an estimated €200 million (\$286 million). -- AFP
