In late April Sister Rosita Caridi-Miller is planning another Italian (Calabrese) meal at her kitchen in Mendon (Cibi deliziosi). Those who attended the Sicilian Dinner last year were treated to a wonderful meal. The Summer Picnic is going to be held at Casa Rube' on Saturday, AUGUST 11 – (rain date Sunday, Aug 12th). Again, as a tribute to our 40th Anniversary and to our members, other than a plate to pass, the event will be without cost to our members. First Lady Nancy and I would like a small committee to help with set up and ideas of how to make this another memorable event to honor our members. WHAT DO THEY REALLY MEAN?

“Morto un papa, se ne fa un altro”

- Direct translation: One pope dies, another will be made
- What it means: There are lots of fish in the sea or Life goes on

“Ogni morte di papa”

- Direct translation: Every death of the pope
- What it means: Once in a blue moon

And then there are Italian expressions with very familiar English equivalents...

“Chi va piano, va sano e va lontano”

- Direct translation: Who goes slowly, goes safely and far
- What it means: Slow and steady wins the race

“Non si può avere la botte piena e la moglie ubriaca”

- Direct translation: You can't have the barrel full and your wife drunk
- What it means: You can't have your cake and eat it too

“Chi dorme non piglia pesci”

- Direct translation: Who sleeps doesn't catch fish
- What it means: The early bird catches the worm

And the few expressions that are confusing when translated...

“Acqua in bocca”

- Direct translation: Water in the mouth
- What it means: Keep quiet, keep it a secret!

“Non vedo l'ora”

- Direct translation: I can't see the hour
- What it means: I can't wait!

And finally there are expressions that are chiefly Italian, like this one that describes Italians' view on marriage.

“Moglie e buoi dei paesi tuoi”

- Direct translation: Wives and oxen of your own land
- What it means: Marry a woman from your own neighborhood

QUIZ for March = Memorable Achievements of Italian Women

(from an article found in March 17, 2011 Italian Tribune Newspaper)



1) She was born in Los Angeles to an award winning director and a legendary singer/actress. She has won 3 Tony Awards, an OSCAR, an Emmy, 2 Golden Globes, and a Grammy.

2) Born in Detroit, she is the daughter of Italian American singer Rose Marie Cassanti and a Lebanese American comedian. After cancellation of her TV sitcom she wrote children's books including the 1973 classic "Free to be... You and me. Married to Phil Donohue and has won 4 Emmys, a Golden Globe, a Grammy and the George Foster Peabody Award.

3) She has had a career as journalist, writer, editor and filmmaker, and is best known for her work in comics and magazines. Working for Marvel Comics she created such characters as Typhoid Mary, Blackheart, Longshot, Mojo and Spiral. Her first superhero series was "Spider-Woman". She specifically addressed societal issues, confronting sexism, racism, and nuclear proliferation while fighting super villains.

4) She was born in Bari, Italy and made her unofficial singing debut in 1934 when she replaced the featured singer in a performance of "Madame Butterfly" by Puccini in Milan. This became her signature role. She made her US debut at the Metropolitan Opera in NY in 1940 singing the first of 72 performances of "Madame Butterfly". In 1995 she was awarded the American National Medal of the Arts by the National Endowment of the Arts and has a Star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame for Recording.

5) She was born in London, England born to Actress Connie Emerald and her father was a popular comedian in 1918. She made her film debut in 1932 in "Her First Affair" which led to a contract with Paramount. She starred in "Anything Goes" with Bing Crosby and Ethel Merman. After switching to Warner Brothers she received Best Actress Award from New York Film Critics for her role in "The Hard Way". In 1949 she formed her own film company, Emerald Productions. She wrote and directed films that tackled controversial social themes. She came to be known as one of Hollywood's pioneering female directors. She directed such TV shows as "Have Gun, Will Travel", "The Untouchables", "Bewitched".

FROM THE NATIONAL SUPREME LODGE ...

- The first Italian-American (and Italian New Yorker), Pietro Cesare Alberti, landed in NYC in 1635? Sister Nancy Rubé has her family lines traced back to this first Italian – American!
- Did you know that the Rome's Coliseum once staged great naval battles? Check out the History Channel's Engineering an Empire series about the history of the Coliseum tunnels.
- Despite the economic downturn, The Guardian reports that Italian's consumed €2.5 billion (\$3.2 b) worth of gelato last year
- Following a contamination scare, the public found out that half of Italy's mozzarella comes 'from abroad.' Italian farmers staged protests following that scare, saying the case reflected a deeper problem of typical Italian products being made outside the country to lower standards
- The Italian national flag, "Il Tricolore," was first adopted on January 7th, 1797 in Reggio Emilia.
