CSJ Report

State CSJ Chairman, Lou Gallo, came to meet with us August 29th. His goal is to visit all Districts during his tenure in this position to assure us that this is an all inclusive organization. The meeting was attended by Lodge CSJ Liaisons, Lodge Presidents, our District 8 State Trustee and other lodge officers. Lou started by commending us in our participation in CSJ projects and for participating via Skype in his monthly meetings. As he went through the current list of CSJ activities he encouraged us to offer suggestions on how the organization can accomplish a positive outcome for these activities. Our group offered several suggestions which he plans to use.

Some of the things we are working on currently are:

- a)** Petition to have Yogi Berra receive the Presidential Medal of Freedom. Yogi turned 90 recently and as many know, presents such a positive image of Italian Americans. 100,000 signatures were needed by June 8th for the Presidential administration to consider it. Once OSIA got involved the goal was easily reached. We await the outcome.
- b)** Dominic Chianese (Uncle Jr. from the Sopranos): He is a singer/musician and appeared in "The Godfather, Part II," and "Gotti". He made an appearance at the Rockland Lodge 6th Annual Feast & Carnival. The CSJ felt that his role in movies & TV should not be the basis for any intervention for his appearance as a musician.
- c)** NY Daily News picture depicting Gov. Cuomo and Mayor DiBlasio as mobsters. This newspaper has a long tradition of bashing Italians. CSJ will intervene using competitive papers as well as their advertisers to have impact.
- d)** Columbus Day Issues: Many activities are going on to save Columbus Day - petitions, education of youth on all the good things done by this Navigator, banners for the Columbus Day parades, a ceremony with wreath at Columbus Statue in Mineola, and dealing with statues of Columbus in New Jersey and Boston being defaced.
- e)** Discussion on Perlasca film "My Italian Secret" - a film about how Italy participated in protecting the Italian Jews from the German Nazis. This movie is dedicated to Walter Wolf and his story of the Holocaust. We would like to acquire this film to show to our membership.
- f)** Wandering Dago, a food truck that travels around to different venues selling Italian food. They have been expelled from some venues because of the use of the word "Dago" in their name. They were due to participate in a Festival in Kinderhook, NY on August 27th. Lou asked us to notify the organizer of this event to try to prevent this food truck from appearing at this event. Many of us called or emailed and lo and behold Lou received an email that the truck was not going to be there.

There were several other issues Lou addressed but our main point is to let all members know there can be great value in upholding and fostering the work of the CSJ. As Lou always says : "SEMPRE AVANTI!"

Italian Garden, Part III

Don't throw out that tomato water!
Tomato water is simply that red-hued tasty liquid that spills from your ripe tomatoes. Here is a recipe adapted from chef Michael Ruhlman that appeared in L'Italo-Americano in August 2014.

Shrimp and Fresh Tomato Pasta with Tomato Water and Basil

1 lb summer ripe tomatoes
1/2 tsp kosher salt, plus more
1/2 cup basil, cut into thin ribbons
1 lb large shrimp, peeled and deveined
1 lb thin pasta
3 Tbsp olive oil, plus more
Freshly ground black pepper
5 large cloves garlic, chopped
1/2 tsp red pepper flakes
3 Tbsp butter

Preparation:

Chop the tomatoes and place in bowl. Season with 1/2 tsp salt. Add the basil. Toss well and set aside for at least 30 minutes. Stir occasionally. Place shrimp in a bowl. Drizzle with a bit of olive oil and season lightly with salt and pepper.

Bring a large pot of salted water to a boil. Cook pasta according to directions until al dente. Reserve 1 cup of pasta water. Drain, place back in pot and drizzle with olive oil to keep it from sticking. Heat the olive oil in a large skillet over medium heat. Heat until hot but not smoking. Add in the shrimp and sauté, turning once, until just cooked through, about 2-3 minutes. Turn the heat to medium low. Using a slotted spoon, transfer the shrimp to a bowl.

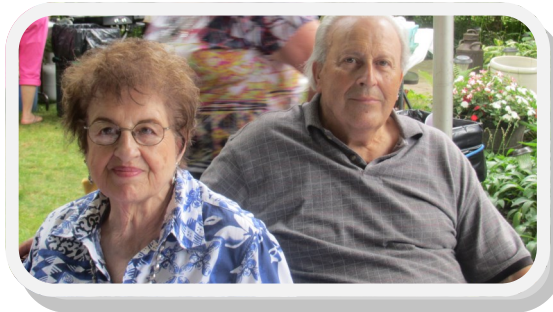
Add the garlic to the oil remaining in the skillet along with the red pepper. Cook until the garlic is soft, about 1-2 minutes. Over the skillet, pour the tomatoes through a fine mesh strainer so that the tomato water is added to the sauce. Set the tomatoes and strainer aside. Bring the sauce to a simmer and add the butter to the skillet. Stir until melted. Add in the pasta. Stir to coat the pasta evenly. Add the shrimp and tomato/basil mixture. Stir. If too dry, add a bit of pasta water to moisten. Buon Appetito!



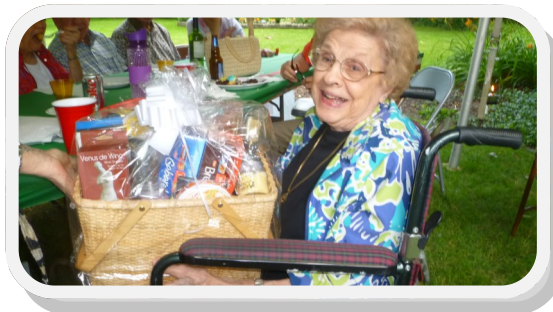
