November 1st—All Saints Day

La Festa di Ognissanti, or the All Saints Feast, is a religious event celebrated on November 1st. This feast celebrates all the saints of the Catholic calendar.

The origins of this feast date back to very ancient times. In fact, records exist of celebrations held in honor of Christian saints even during the very first centuries of the development of Christianity. Writings related to the dedication by Pope Boniface IV of the Roman Pantheon to "Mary and all the martyrs" on May 13th 609 AD can be considered as the symbolic text inaugurating the tradition.

Over the course of time, the feast was moved to November 1st for reasons that are still unclear. There are claims that All Saints Day was moved to November by Alcuin, the counselor of Charlemagne, so that the Church could christianize the pagan feast of the Celtic New Year, which allowed for celebrations to last three whole days. Whatever the reason, it was decided that the feast would take place in November and, as of June 1st, 1949, the Italian Constitution listed the day of Ognissanti as a public holiday.

Our last initiations for the year will be held at our General Assembly meeting on December 10th. If you have anyone who is interested in joining the lodge, please let them know that applications should be in by November 4th.

Commission on Social Justice District Chair: Brother Joe Rubé

During the past month the CSJ has continued in its pursuit of fighting negative bias and bigotry against Italians and Italian Americans, and just as importantly, promotion of positive image recognition of many Italians and Italian Americans. The CSJ has temporarily suspended its drive to obtain signatures for the petition to save Columbus Day. The issue is not resolved by any means but the national organization is reviewing how we can join with other organizations in making this a more formidable process. Some of our newer activities include:

1) Support of the efforts of Doug Gladstone and Lou Del Bianco to have the

- Director of the National Park Service, wherein Mount Rushmore is located, to acknowledge Luigi Del Bianco's masterly work in the carving of the figures on Mount Rushmore. Called the "Chief Carver of the Project" by his boss, Luigi is barely mentioned as participating in the project.
- 2) In Bridgeport, Connecticut, the school board made a decision to rename Columbus Day as Indigenous Peoples Day. The item was not on their agenda and only six board members were present. No one in the public community knew the item was going to be discussed. An attempt to revisit this item was blocked. A petition went out immediately to have the "NATIONAL" holiday reinstated. We are asked to support this petition. Possible legal action to be considered against the Bridgeport School Board.
- 3) There have been some very negative comments made by columnists George Will and Colin Meyler, making fun of Yogi Berra by describing his facial features as "Neanderthal" and "apelike".

I do want to emphasize that every effort is made by your Local CSJ District Chair to get all updates to you through communications with the Lodge CSJ Liaisons, Deputies, and Presidents, and by asking you, when appropriate, to send letters to those requested by our State CSJ Chairman, Lou Gallo.

November 2nd—All Souls Day

This feast is directly tied to the celebration of All Saints Day, and follows it directly on the calendar, on November 2nd. The direct link between the two days can be traced back to 998 AD, when the Abbot Odilo of Cluny established the day to remember the dead should follow the day celebrating all the Saints, mainly because the dead were believed to be able to intercede with God for the living, very much like saints.

It is also not surprising that Catholics chose to honor the dead during this time period. Many ancient civilizations celebrated the dead in the months of October and November, likely owing to the fact that the coming winter was in direct contrast to the rebirth of spring.

The date of November 2nd is also connected to the Day of the Deluge as told in the Genesis, hence making many people believe it was chosen to remember those who perished during it and exorcise another similar disaster. All Souls Day has a common denominator in many parts of Italy: the

belief the departed will visit that day. Even though it is a religious event, there are many popular traditions that remain alive to this day, which combine pagan and Catholic elements.

The entire country is united in celebrating All Saints and All Souls
Day by honoring the dead, a habit mirrored in the loving care taken in the weeks running to those days in preparing, cleaning and decorating graves, in a manner which is extremely close to that typical of Mexican and, more generally, South American tradition.
